What is Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals?

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals is an opportunity for eligible undocumented youth, who were brought to the United States as children, to stay in the country, apply for work authorization, and fully participate as members of the community.

Who Qualifies?

Undocumented youth:

- Who came to the United States before their 16th birthday;
- Were under 31 years old on June 15, 2012;
- Were present in the United States on June 15, 2012;
- Have continuously resided in the United States since June 15, 2007;
- Have graduated or currently are in school; and
- Have not committed a felony or significant misdemeanor.
